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# IMPORTANT EVENT INFO Companion Cards

If you have a disability and a lifelong need for 'attendant care support' in order to participate in community activities and attend venues, the Companion Card can help you with the costs of getting out and about with the support of a companion.

Companion Card holders receive a second 'companion' ticket at no charge at participating venues and on public transport. The 'companion' ticket is also exempt from booking fees.

A companion is any person who accompanies a cardholder and provides attendant care support. The cardholder's chosen companion may be a paid or unpaid assistant or carer, family member, friend or partner.

## UPDATE FROM THE CEO

So much has happened since the last newsletter – I recall writing my last article whilst I was on annual leave travelling out to the Birdsville races ensuring we got through the flooded road to return in time for Disability Action Week with the Community Fun Day on Sunday 11 September and Flexi Queensland Awards Night on Saturday 17 September. These were both wonderful events that were attended by more people than in previous years and was only possible due to the detailed planning and organising by Teneill, Hana and Steve with assistance from the other members of Centre Team. In reflecting back – it all seems such a long time ago now.

#### **NDIS Update**

NDIS rollout has well and truly commenced in the Burdekin with the first Flexi families having their meetings in mid October. Since then it has been full steam ahead and although Flexi is making progress in getting Service Agreements in place for Service Users and putting into place new processes behind the scenes, we are challenged on a daily basis by this new way of doing business and having to seek clarification from NDIA on the finer points of how the scheme is designed to operate. I take comfort from the fact that it is not only Flexi Queensland in this situation – service providers in Townsville and other areas are navigating through the same issues.

For those of you who have had your Planning meetings you will be aware that from that day your funding transitions from Queensland Government funding (Disability Service or Community Care) to NDIS funding even though you may not receive a copy of your plan for up to a week later in many cases. Don't worry Flexi will continue to provide your usual services during this time so as not to cause any disruption but we will be putting in place an Interim Service Agreement so we are all covered for the cost of delivering services and when your NDIS Plan arrives we can start to work out in more detail what services you wish to purchase from Flexi Queensland and setting up the full Service Agreement. Please bear with us during this time and you will certainly have the opportunity to seek out new services as the scope of funding is much wider with more options than under the funding received from Queensland Government.

For those of you who are still waiting to be contacted by NDIA with a date for your Planning Meeting, just a reminder Flexi Queensland can assist with helping you prepare for what it entails and attend the meeting with you if you require.

Please contact the office if you wish to make an appointment with Joy and I to discuss your preparations for NDIS.

The changes that have come about with NDIS since the 1 July 2016 has enabled Flexi Queensland the opportunity to seek NDIS registration in some new support groups - please find below the full listing of services Flexi Queensland is now currently registered with NDIS to provide:

- Assistance with daily personal activities
- Assistance with high intensity daily personal activities
- Assistance with daily life tasks in a group or shared living arrangements (supported accommodation)
- Behaviour support
- Development of daily living and life skills
- Participation in community, social and civic activities
- Innovative Community Participation
- Group and Centre Based Activities
- Accommodation/Tenancy assistance
- Assistance to access and maintain employment
- Assistance to integrate into school or other educational program
- Therapeutic supports (speech therapy)
- Early intervention supports for early childhood
- Assistive technology specialist assessment, set up and training (speech therapy)
- Communications and Information Equipment (speech therapy resources)
- Assistance in coordinating or managing life stages, transitions and supports (support connection/coordination of supports)
- Assistance with travel/transport arrangements
- Training for independence in travel and transport
- Household tasks
- Physical wellbeing activities
- Management of funding for supports in a participant's plan (plan management).

Also please take the time to read Stephanie Gianni's article in this newsletter on the new speech therapy services she will be providing under NDIS. The speech therapy service will be delivered at the newly signed and named Flexi Queensland Therapy and Activity Centre (formerly referred to as The Hangout) on Chippendale Street.

#### **Congratulations to Our Trainees**

Flexi Queensland has been able to offer traineeship opportunities over the last few years – this is important in providing work and training in our sector to young people in the Burdekin as they embark on adulthood.

Ally Shand successfully completed her School Based Traineeship with Flexi Queensland on Friday 18 November - during this two year traineeship Ally assisted with the delivery of support services to our Service Users and completed a Certificate III in Disabilities in record time – we wish Ally all the very best with the next chapter in her life following completion of Year 12 at Burdekin Catholic High.

Toni Morgan joined Flexi in January this year and through her hard work and dedication completed her Certificate III in Business Administration early finalising her traineeship on 30 November. Furthermore she was the successful applicant in the recruitment for a second TRACCS Officer to assist Sarah with rostering and NDIS claiming – welcome to your new permanent role in the Centre Team Toni.

Sarah Newman is about to start her Certificate III in Business Administration.

#### **Christmas Period**

In previous years we only provided essential services to people during the two week Christmas period and those Service Users receiving community access funding had a two week break from supports – this was around the funding programs for Disability Services and Community Care. Now many people are receiving their funding under NDIS this gives them more flexibility about when they want their services.

The office will be closed from Wednesday 21 December 2016 and will reopen on Wednesday 4 January 2017 – there will be a few staff working during that time as we try to catch up on refining our NDIS process and we will be providing the essential services to people who have daily supports to assist them with their daily routines. In order to gauge who would like services during this time so we can have sufficient staff rostered to cover the shifts a member of the Centre Team will be phoning all families so see if you require any services during this two week period. If you know you want services you can call the office and speak with your DSF to work out hours and times.

Flexi Queensland is holding the end of year celebration on Wednesday 14 December at the Burdekin Bowl and everyone is welcome to attend. You should have already received a flyer about this event but if not please contact the office to find out more. I look forward to seeing everyone there having a great time.

If you have any questions about Flexi Queensland and NDIS please contact the office either myself or Joy Cornford will hopefully be able to provide some answers — if not we will find out for you from NDIA.

#### Introducing Flexi Queensland Speech Pathology Service

#### What is a Speech Pathologist?

Speech pathologists study, diagnose and treat communication disorders, including difficulties with speaking, listening, understanding language, reading, writing, social skills, stuttering and using voice. They work with people who have difficulty communicating because of developmental delays, stroke, brain injuries, learning disability, intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, dementia and hearing loss, as well as other problems that can affect speech and language. People who experience difficulties swallowing food and drink safely can also be helped by a speech pathologist. (Speech Pathology Australia, 2016)

#### **Our Team**

Speech Pathologist Stephanie Gianni is registered with Speech Pathology Australia and is an approved provider under the NDIS. Stephanie is dedicated to working with families to achieve the best communication outcomes possible. Stephanie is trained in the PODD program and is mentored by professionals with extensive knowledge in the disability field. Stephanie advocates for individual and family centered practice, and is looking forward to meeting new clients and their families.

#### **Further details**

Speech Pathologist Stephanie Gianni is ready to begin work with those who have gained funding for 'therapies' in their NDIS plan. A Service Agreement with Flexi Queensland will be prepared by the Centre Team staff to begin the purchase of therapy from our Speech Pathologist. A Consent Agreement will also be signed by the person accessing the service and their families to ensure the highest level of care can be delivered whilst ensuring transparency of future therapy processes. This consent form will be discussed at length between the Speech Pathologist and the necessary parties to ensure all are comfortable with the information. The intensity of therapy depends on the level of funding awarded in the persons plan, as well as timing that suits the service user and their family. Our Speech Pathology service is flexible in providing options for 30 minute, 45 minute or 60 minute sessions.

#### **Our Therapy Centre**

Our therapy room is located in the 'Therapy and Activity Centre' building on Chippendale Street, Ayr and has been signed to allow for easy viewing from the street. This room caters for physical needs of both adults and children, with facilities for parents to make coffee in a quiet space (if they are not directly attending sessions), and access to an all abilities rest room. Therapy will involve hands-on activities and in some cases, work within the community itself. For most individuals, long periods of 'sit down' work in the clinic room is not motivating or conducive to success, a fact our Speech Pathologist readily takes on board when planning therapy sessions. Therefore, therapy can often involve going out into the community to practice functional communication skills. For some clients, visits to the Therapy and Activity Centre will not be a viable option. In these instances, the Flexi Centre team staff along with our Speech Pathologist






may be able to organise home visits.

#### How sessions run

Our Speech Pathologist will work very closely in the first sessions – particularly with the family and clients themselves – to develop functional goals that will hold meaning and importance in your lives. Meetings with families at the beginning of your therapy journey will be essential to achieving these goals. We aim to be as flexible as possible in ensuring these meetings can work around the busy lives of our families. Our Speech Pathologist can offer face to face appointments during work hours, after hours, by phone or Skype. Our therapy service uses the Goal Attainment Scaling or GAS method of goal setting. This allows small, however powerful gains to be measured and highlighted through the therapy process. If a client is receiving other therapy services, our Speech Pathologist is more than happy to liaise with these professionals and share session notes or reports as required. Progress reports will be developed in 3 and 6 monthly increments, followed by a detailed yearly progress report.
